This group of 225 students have generally settled in very well to the school and staff have recognised we have a group of young people with energy, perseverance, leadership and teamwork skills, all of which will serve them well in their high school journey. They have had a great transition to high school and are representing our values of respect, responsibility and excellence to a very high standard.

Our NAPLAN performance in 2021, by any measure, was a phenomenal achievement, with the school attaining improvement in all areas of literacy and numeracy and the students achieving at a level higher than at any time in the past 10 years. The school is proud of the educational programs we run and the support we provide students, so it was pleasing to see students reap the benefits of this last year.

The staff are equally determined to improve outcomes and results for our students this year and will continue to support them to be the best they can. Many of our staff come in during the holidays and work long beyond the school hours, to ensure every student is given the opportunity to realise their potential. Teaching is a rewarding yet difficult job, and I admire daily, the teachers at this school who enrich the educational experience of our students.

Fly with your own wings...

Schools are steeped in history, including our very own campus.

With the opening of Wallsend High School in 1960, the school's original logo, a shield with a golden eagle standing on a wall within a shield, originates from the Coat of Arms from the Borough of Wallsend in England. Wallsend's first principal received permission from The English town's Council to use this powerful symbol, which itself originates from the Roman Empire. The English town of Wallsend is situated on a Roman Army campsite defending Hadrian's Wall, and at that time the Roman Army's emblem was a Roman eagle.

The motto chosen to marry with the Eagle emblem was Alis Volat Propiis, "he flies with his own wings", to encourage a student to depend on yourself, and not on others. Although our motto is no longer in Latin, today we still maintain a strong focus in our teaching and learning for student self agency.

From a local perspective, the eagle's connection to our land is even more historic. The significance of this beautiful, powerful bird of prey has long been part of the Awabakal people's rich cultural and spiritual connections to Country and each other, linked through the Dreaming. Biraban, the eagle hawk, is held in highest regard by our coastal tribes.

Now, when you notice the eagle proudly on display in our entrance and throughout the grounds, you can appreciate that it is deeply embedded in the history of our school and the land on which we stand.

Attendance Matters

In 2022 we continue to focus on improving attendance across the school (other than Covid-19 absences). It is proven that attendance plays a major role in students' engagement and success in learning.

There will be major prizes on offer for students whose attendance is greater than 90% each term and a major prize for a student whose attendance is greater than 90% for the whole year.

We appreciate parents support in ensuring students are arriving at school, in uniform and fully equipped for their learning by 8.55am. Please do not hesitate to call if you have any concerns. If a student is late to school they will need a signed and dated note from a parent or carer, explaining why they are late. They are to give the note to the Administration Office who will issue them with a Late Slip, which can be given to the class teacher.

If your child is absent from school, the Department of Education Attendance Policy states that any absence must be explained within 7 days. To explain an absence you can telephone the Administration Office, send an SMS to 0429 550 188 or reply to the absence SMS or email you receive, or send in a note with your student on their first day back.

Don't forget, you only have 7 days to explain.
